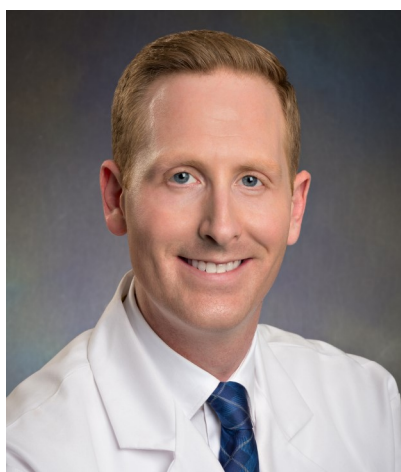

The symposium will focus on presentations and discussions with a goal to optimize recognition of skin cancer and understand referral pathways to support patients in Long-Term Care. The presentation will provide attendees with information on disease epidemiology, features, and recognition while highlighting the importance of referral for multi-disciplinary management.

Symposium Objectives:

1. To raise awareness among healthcare professionals working in LTC homes of the rising rates of non-melanoma skin cancers (NMSCs).
2. To gain an understanding of how NMSCs are diagnosed and treated, highlighting the importance of early referral to specialists.
3. To foster discussion on current practice and management of suspected skin cancer in LTC with a goal to further optimize care and improve patient outcomes.
